**1.     Minutes of the Last Meeting – 18<sup>TH</sup> October**

### **4. Financial Report – Malcolm Wall**

Malcolm and David Bishop met to discuss the council finances. Collections raised just under £4,000 compared to £3,000 which was the average over the last year. Large sums of money had been spent on renovations etc. Oak products: we have sold just under a £1,000-worth with a 30% profit margin. Tosin has been helping with the setting up of the website. Judith asked for the website address. Malcolm to provide address. There is a Facebook and Instagram page up and running. A certificate will be provided with the oak products.

Thanks to Tosin, Brenda and Malcolm Wall for the hard work which they have provided.

Judith Bishop asked is the money going to in support of charities and the maintenance of the church. Lore mentioned that the money should go to the work of Christ Church.

Malcolm Wall to provide a draft of the certificate. Lore and Malcolm to meet and discuss before the final certificate goes to print.

### **Parish Share**

## **5. Worship and Ministry**

On 9th November a meeting took place at the Guildhall. Justin Welby attended along with Bishops of Bath and Wells. Malcolm Wall represented Christ Church. The message was 'Faith in the Community' emphasising Charities, Police and BANES. Group session included: Community Hubs – best use of resources, Street Community, An Inclusive Community and Young People in Today's World.

### **Advent Morning Prayer – 28<sup>th</sup> November**

There has been a request to hold the early morning service in the Sacristy. At the moment this is being used as small chapel for the children, which has proved very popular. This is only temporary while we think about the re-ordering of the church.

Lore suggested about handing out Christmas Cards to visitors. The Council agreed.

Norland Nannies' Carol Service will be held at Christ Church on 9<sup>th</sup> December at 10.00.

**Discernment Day** - There is a group which consists of Rowena, Malcolm, Alex, Mark, Lore, Beatrice to provide artistic output, Rowena to provide input on a disabled persons' view and Isaac as a young person's view.

### **Pastoral Care**

The team will be reconvening. There have been meetings. The discussions took place on co-ordination, who needs pastoral care, who is providing it, prayer for people on the pray list and for the people who are serving them. Volunteers are required to help with lifts to and from church. If anyone wishes to be involved in the pastoral care team please contact Lore or Keri.

## **6. Charities**

The charities sub-group met and want to put the following possibilities to the council.

Bath Gideons wish to come in January and will give a short presentation.

USPG (now called US) is a charity which Christ Church supports long term, it was suggested that throughout the year the months of March, July and November are earmarked for US collections.

Ian has suggested that the bell ringers who will be ringing a quarter peal before the Advent Service would like to do this as a sponsored peel in aid of Strike Back Against Blood Cancer. Alex suggested a collection at the Carol Service. This will be announced to the congregation. Proposed by Georgina Bowman seconded by Penny Edwards. The vote was unanimous.

Ian is chairman of the Church Housing Trust. Ian gave an insight into what Church Housing Trust is about. The trust provides for the homeless, furniture etc.

Other charities discussed were Bath Mind, Bath Food Bank, Bath Dementia Action Alliance, possibly Bath Street Pastors, Local Women's Refuge, Julian House and Genesis. Further discussion will be held in at the next council meeting in January 2017.

Gideons will be the charity for the month of January 2017. Proposed by Ian Hay Davison and seconded by Malcolm Wall. The vote was unanimous.

### **Inclusiveness**

Lore briefly introduced a request from the Lesbian and Gay Christian Movement that churches consent to be listed as a 'Visible Congregation,' meaning that they are visibly welcome to all. This is particularly significant in the present political climate since on November 13 2016 GAFCON published a paper publicly 'naming and shaming' Anglican ordained ministers in same sex relationships.

Simon Tatton-Brown brought this to Lore's attention. Council were given copies of the proposed statement. Inclusiveness to be discussed at the next meeting.

### **Hospitality**

Lore thanked Judith Bishop and her team for the hard work carried out which went well. The Italian evening was a great success.
